1. Call to Order

3. Consider Approval of Minutes

1. Call to Order

2. [Public Comment](#)

The Bismarck Integration Facilitator, Heather May, suggested notifying Mandan nominees that they were nominated for the Bismarck Humanitarian Award, and to let City of Mandan Administration know there may be interest for a Humanitarian Award for Mandan.

3. Consider Approval of Minutes

Chair Houle noted Levi Engelstad's last name was misspelled. Member Wutzke motioned to approve the minutes with the change in spelling, Vice Chair Klein seconded. M/C

4. Community Conversations

Vice Chair Klein gave an update from the subcommittee. The subcommittee suggested the next topic still be related to homelessness, but focusing more on what resources are available, such as medical, housing, food, and transportation, and the importance of making sure those resources are known. The committee discussed how they can make all the resources we have in the community known to the people who may need them. Member Wutzke suggested focusing on a topic that hasn't previously been talked about, such as mental health and substance abuse. It was proposed that the subcommittee meet again and form a list of potential topics and then send that list out to the rest of the committee to vote on.

Chair Houle reported that all three of the nominees for the three categories for the Humanitarian Award will be present at the June 23 Commission Meeting to receive their award. Chair Houle and Member Jorgensen will be presenting the awards to the nominees.

6. HOBY Student Leadership Presentation

Chair Houle, Vice Chair Klein and Members Wutzke and Jorgensen will be presenting at the HOBY Seminar on Saturday, June 20, showcasing who the HRC is and how members of the Human Relations Committee show leadership within the community.

7. Community Events

Member Fettig-Loftesnes reported that event went well, with a lot of interest in the HRC booth.

B. Capital City Pride - Debrief

Chair Houle reported that the event went well, with a lot of attendees approaching the HRC booth. The committee discussed coming up with talking points about the HRC for when they have booths at events.

Chair Houle and members Jorgensen and Zarr will be volunteering for the Juneteenth event at Dykshoorn Park in Mandan.
